President's Report

PTF Conversions Part II

In my last report in the January/February edition of the *Speaks* I reported on the conversions of eight PTF's to fulltime CC2 positions. This month I have more good news. On April 7th the USPS Detroit District agreed to convert 12 more PTF's into residual CC2 positions. The following offices have been approved to convert PTF's: Taylor 2, Dearborn 2, Westland/Canton 3, Dearborn Heights 3, and Lincoln Park 2. We are in the process of reviewing the remaining residual vacancies Branchwide and will be prepared to file the necessary grievances to ensure that any remaining CC2 residual positions left are filled.

Route Inspections /MRA

In March the Branch was notified by the Detroit District that they would be conducting Formal Route Counts and Inspections in four of our Branch 2184-represented offices. They are Dearborn Main, Dearborn Heights, Lincoln Park and Trenton. Upon receiving official notice, I contacted Don Dombrow, the acting POOM II, to see if there was any interest in doing Minor Route Adjustments (MRA's). After some discussion he said he would like to see a copy of our old MRA agreement that we used prior to JARAP. I provided him a copy and we agreed to meet and further discuss the possibilities of doing the MRA's jointly.

After much discussion with the District we were unable to reach an agreement to do minor route adjustments at all four locations. However, they did agree to do Joint MRA's at the Dearborn Main and Lincoln Park stations. With that being said, we will now prepare for the full blown mail counts and inspections in Dearborn Heights 48127/48128 and Trenton. They are both scheduled to start April 28 and continue through May 11. The Branch will be conducting a Route Inspection Class for the Dearborn Heights and Trenton carriers, to be held here at the Branch hall

Save America's Postal Service

On April 12, the NALC held "Save America's Postal Service" demonstrations outside of United States Senate member's offices across the country. The demonstrations were held to bring attention to pending legislation and to put pressure on the senators to oppose Senate bill 1789. Our Branch, along with Branch 1 got together and held a demonstration outside of Senator Debbie Stabenow's office in the Marquette Building on West Congress in Detroit. The demonstration took place to make the public aware of the dangers of passing S. 1789, which would hurt the Postal Service by ending six day delivery, phasing out doorto-door mail delivery, and not fully addressing the onerous pre-funding requirements or the overpayments into the CSRS pension fund. Senator Stabenow has already told the NALC that she stands

with us and would not vote to pass S. 1789 in its current form. Thank you Senator Stabenow, for your consistent support of letter carriers and our families!

EVP's Report

Keeping Focused

As of April 18, 2012, the United States Postal Service's future is hanging in the halls of the U.S. Senate. The Senate has brought S.1789 to the floor for debate. As written S.1789 will put the USPS in a downward spiral that it may never overcome. The bill (S.1789) will dismantle the USPS by taking away many of the services that the US public have come accustomed to. Such as, receiving mail 6 days a week, getting mail delivered to your door, delivery standards that get mail to its destination within a day or two. Taking away services will send our customers away to seek alternative delivery and will create a loss of revenue. This loss of revenue will only push the USPS further into a downward cycle and will never break even with it's operational costs. If this is to pass, I fear in a couple of years down the road they will be talking of more cuts such as 4 day or 3 day delivery.

When will it end?

In October 2011 the NALC hired the international financial advisory firm, Lazard. The Lazard firm has extensive experience in restructuring strategy. They came out with a white paper on April 17, 2012 "Delivering Change to Revitalize an American Icon" which you may view at www.nalc.org. What they discuss in their findings is that the USPS needs a business model that should expand its products and services, be given flexibility in its pricing of such products and services and better leveraging of the USPS delivery network to grow its parcel service business. They also address the burdensome and unique Congressional mandate

requiring USPS to pre-fund retiree health care for the next 75 years in just 10 years by calling for legislative action to correct this problem. Lazard further goes on to say the USPS plan of shrinking services to survive is unlikely to succeed and will instead quite possibly worsen its business situation.

As many of you know or have known for some time that we are defiantly in the battle of our careers. At no time in my 26 years of service has so much been at stake. We all have an interest in what is happening. We have come a long way in telling the public and anyone who will listen as to what is actually going on with the USPS. Having this problem go on and on with no resolution may make one feel tired or helpless in their efforts. That's where we should keep focused on this issue until there is a resolve that will serve all those interested in the survival of the USPS and not its demise.

Laura Schaeffer, a transitional employee letter carrier in the Lincoln Park, Michigan post office and a member of NALC Branch 2184, noticed that packages from a company that used "Federal Express Smart Post" and were delivered by the USPS as part of a third party arrangement, could instead have been just processed and delivered entirely through the USPS. She notified the NALC Customer Connect coordinator in her office, Branch 2184 member Paula Hall, about this potential sale. This lead ultimately resulted in a \$1,136,000 sale for the USPS. TE Schaeffer noted that she "wanted to help the company, so that they can hire her as fulltime employee."

The Lincoln Park, Michigan post office is a fine example of what an atmosphere of cooperation can accomplish for the benefit of the Postal Service. There is excellent communication and teamwork from the union (NALC steward Scott Watts), management (Postmaster Joe Bodary), as well as the dedication of NALC Customer Connect Coordinator Paula Hall and other Lincoln Park employees. During the past three years, Customer Connect leads from office Coordinator Paula Hall alone have resulted in an additional \$536,748 in revenue

for the Postal Service. This cooperative joint approach is making the program a great success. Despite its relatively small size, (only 45 city letter carriers), Lincoln Park is the number one office for Customer Connect sales in the entire USPS Detroit District!

Work Smart

With route inspections around the corner carriers should be doing their duties by the book. For example:

Taking a full 30 minute lunch
Taking two ten minute breaks
Doing vehicle inspection
Picking up parcels for parcel pickup
Write up parcel notices when customers aren't
home

Dropping off mail in collection run boxes before the one p.m. pickup

Clearing your accountables

By taking the time to do these things you can save your route from any additions. Our mail volume has dropped a little. You have to do things right and under the right function. Doing office work using your street time will not get you any credit for your street time. "Work Smart!" Stay focused and calm and we will make it though this next round of route inspections. No one should know more about your route than you. So speak up during your consultations. Thank you everyone who has called their senators when you were asked to. Special thanks to everyone who attended the rally. There will be more rally's and calling of our senators in the near future. So stay connected, and informed of the news. "Get Involved."


